





### **Calculate Field of View**

The FOV determines the size of the infrared measurement area according to the distance.






### **Typical application schematics**

### SMBus compatible 2-wire protocol

- The TB(P) series supports a 2 wire serial protocol. And the TB(P) only supports two protocols on standard SMBus interface.


Supported commands are: Read Word, Write Word

#### **Functional description**

The TB(P) sensor module can only be used as a slave device. Maximum number of devices on one bus is 127, higher pull-up currents are recommended for higher number of devices, faster bus data transfer rates, and increased reactive loading of the bus. If the access to the device is a read operation it will respond with 16 data bits and 8 bit PEC only if its own slave address.

### **Bus Protocol**

The TB(P) sensors are preset to address 0x3A by default.



 $<sup>^{\</sup>star}$  The PEC calculation includes all bits except the START, REPEATED START, STOP, ACK, and NACK bits. The PEC is a CRC-8 with polynomial X8+X2+X1+1. The MSB(Most Significant Bit) of every byte is transferred first.

### Packet Error Code(PEC) Calculation

A packet error checking mechanism according to SMBus specification version 1.1 is implemented. The packet error checking of SMBus devices uses an 8-bit cyclic redundancy check (CRC-8) to calculate the PEC.

The polynomial used is C(x) = 100000111 (= x8 + x2 + x + 1).

The PEC calculation includes all bytes in the transmission, including address, command and data. It does not include ACK, NACK, START, STOP bits. Refer to the Arduino example code for detailed PEC calculation.



The MSB of the temperature data is an error flag (active high).

Please note after POR additional delay is needed before first reading can be started.

### - code example read Object temperature 0x07

- 0. power on & wait for sensor initialization(≥200ms)
- 1. Send START bit
- 2. Send 0x74 : [Slave Address(0x3A by default) + Wr(0)]
- 3. ACK from Slave
- 4. Send Command: 0x07 (Object) [ Ambient: 0x06 ]
- 5. ACK from Slave
- 6. Send repeated Start
- 7. Send 0x75: [Slave Address(0x3A) + Rd(1)]
- 8. ACK from slave
- 9. Read Data Byte Low (Send ACK)
- 10. Read Data Byte High (Send ACK)
- 11. Read PEC (Send ACK or NACK)
- 12. Send Stop bit
- 13. Wait >100ms & repeat 1...13

### **Object Temperature To**

To is the object temperature derived from thermopile and ambient sensor outputs as absolute (Kelvin) temperature

$$T_o \left[ {}^{\circ}K \right] = T_o reg \times 0.02$$

Please note that 1LSB corresponds to  $0.02^{\circ}\text{C}$  and the MSB bit is error flag (if "1" then error). Maximum register value is 0x7FFF - maximum possible value returned by TB(P) The result is calculated by following expressions (valid for both To and Ta):

- 1. Convert it to decimal value i.e. 0x3B99 = 15.257d
- 2. Multiply by 0.02(or divide by 50) i.e.  $15,257 \times 0.02 = 305.14$ °K (result in Kelvin)
- 3. Convert K  $\to$  °C i.e. 305.14 273.15 = 31.99°C

### **Ambient Temperature Ta**

The Sensor die temperature is measured with a PTAT element. All the sensors conditioning and data processing is handled on-chip.

### **Emissivity Correction Coefficient**


The TB(P) is calibrated for an object emissivity of 0.97. It can be easily customized by the customer for any other emissivity in the range 0.1...1.0.

Factory default 0.97 = 63,568(0xF850)

 $(0.97 *65536) - 1 = 63568.92 \text{ round down} \rightarrow 63568$ 



#### **Write Word**



Before changing of cell contents the respective cells need to be erased. Erasing is a writing of zeros to the respective Command Address. After writing operation the device needs 5ms to process the new values. After changing the "Command Address" cell contents, it is strongly recommended to restart the sensor by power off/on.

- 4. Send Data Byte Low : 0x00 (for erasing)

- 6. Send PEC: 0x05 (calculated CRC value)
- 7. Send STOP bit
- 8. Wait 5ms

Writing : (Slave Address  $0x3A \rightarrow 0x4C$ )

- 9. Send START bit
- 10. Send 0x74 : [Slave Address(0x3A by default) + Wr(0)]
- 11. Send Command: 0x2E
- 12. Send Data Byte Low: 0x4C
- 13. Send Data Byte High: 0x00
- 14. Send PEC: 0xA2 (calculated CRC value)
- 15. Send STOP bit

### **Timing**

The TB(P) meets all the timing specifications of the SMBus. The maximum frequency of the TB(P) SMBus is 100KHz and the minimum is 10KHz.

The specific timings in TB(P)'s SMBus are:

<u>Timeout L</u> is the maximum allowed time for SCL to be low during communication.

After this time the TB(P) will reset its communication block and will be ready for new communication – not more than 27ms;

<u>Timeout H</u> is the maximum allowed time for SCL to be high during communication. After this time TB(P) will reset its communication block assuming that the bus is idle (according to the SMBus specification) – not more than 45µs.


 $\underline{\mathsf{Tsuac}(\mathsf{SD})}$  is the time after the eighth falling edge of SCL that TB(P) will force SDA low to acknowledge the last received byte – not more than 2.5 $\mu$ s.

<u>Thdac(SD)</u> is the time after the ninth falling edge of SCL that TB(P) will release the SDA (so the MD can continue with the communication) – not more than 1.5µs.

<u>Tsuac(MD)</u> is the time after the eighth falling edge of SCL that TB(P) will release SDA (so that the MD can acknowledge the last received byte) – not more than 1.5µs.

<u>Thdac(MD)</u> is the time after the ninth falling edge of SCL that TB(P) will take control of the SDA (so it can continue with the next byte to transmit) – not more than 1.5µs.

The indexes MD and SD for the latest timings are used – MD when the master device is making acknowledge; SD when the slave device is making acknowledge.

The data on SDA must be changed when SCL is low (min 300ns after the falling edge of SCL). The data is fetched by both MD and SDs on the rising edge of the SCL.

### **Products handling precaution**

- **X** Water resistance is not guaranteed.





- TB-I2C-H08







- TB-I2C-H08






### **PC Software**
